The plans and specifications for the above irrigation system have been reviewed by Valley Municipal Utility District No. 2 (the District) and appear to comply with the requirements of backflow and cross connection prevention. The District reserves the right to inspect and possibly reject the irrigation system installation. Irrigation system installations or repairs must comply with State Laws (including the requirement that they are designed by a Licensed Irrigator in the State of Texas, where applicable). Generally, applicants are forbidden from placing any landscaping materials (besides grass), including irrigation infrastructure within public easements. Exceptions may be made, under certain circumstances, and with the submission of a written request.

Applicants choosing to utilize resaca pumps do so at their own risk. The District does not make any claims as to the quality of the water in the resaca. It is not uncommon for aquatic weeds to grow in the resaca which can clog resaca pump intakes. In addition, the pump shall be installed by a licensed electrician and placed at such an elevation where it is unlikely to be submerged during a flood event. The District does not compensate customers for pumps which have been damaged by aquatic weeds, flooding, or any other issue. Pump intake piping should terminate as close to the edge of the resaca as possible. The District utilizes a pontoon boat for resaca maintenance, and the District does not compensate customers for damage to pump intake piping by District employees. Customers who utilize resaca pumps must pay the current monthly fee which is set by the Board of Directors. Pumps for commercial properties shall be metered with the applicant paying for the cost of the meter.

**A permit must also be applied for with the Town of Rancho Viejo.**
